Trio Sonata in A–Minor

for Recorder, Violin (Traverse Flute) and Basso continuo



This sonata is written in the period style of the late baroque and can therefore be played on a variety of instruments, depending on the available forces. While style and tessitura of the top voice particularly fit an alto recorder, the second voice works equally well on a violin, traverse flute or voice flute (recorder in d).

The figured bass can be realized on a harpsichord with a viol (gamba) doubling the bass line. When no viol is available, it can however also be played on a harpsichord or archlute alone. When a doubling bass instrument is used, the bass solo in bars 92ff should be played by this instrument alone, and the harpsichord comes in again with the figures in bar 97.
